The mission of the department is to be one of the best economics departments in Asia. It aims to attain international recognition through the quality of its teaching programs, research output, and public service.

In its teaching programs, a balance is struck between the general methodologies of modern economic analysis and current economic topics that are of interest to the Asia-Pacific region.

The department emphasizes frontier academic research, as well as the application of rigorous and systematic analysis to important economic issues of the day. It plans to build core research groups in: (1) econometrics, (2) economic growth and development, (3) industrial organization and theory of the firm, (4) international economics, and (5) Chinese economy. In addition, researchers in applied and theoretical microeconomics and macroeconomics will focus on topics of particular interest to the Asia-Pacific region.

The faculty provides public service based on their expertise and research findings.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

Economics is a social science that deals with the allocation of resources within and across firms, households, and other decision-making units. It also deals with the functional and personal distribution of income. As such, it covers the operation and organization of firms and industries, the determination of prices for factors and products, as well as the determinants of economic growth and development. It analyzes production, consumption, investment, employment, trade, and government intervention including fiscal, monetary, and regulatory policies. Thus, both micro- and government. To reflect the twin roles of economics, the Department offers two degree programs: (1) Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) in Economics, and (2) Bachelor of Science (BSc) in Economics and Finance.

The main differences between these two programs are the perspectives from which problems are analyzed and the applications emphasized. In the first program, the focus is on problems closely related to a company's external economic environment and/or internal operation, and on economic reasoning which can contribute to sound business decision making. In the second program, the focus is on the scientific basis of economics and finance and on a wide range of economic phenomena, problems, and solutions that require sophisticated analytical skills and quantitative methods.
